Plan:



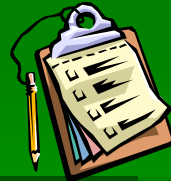
- Establish a set of tools to

Tactic 1:



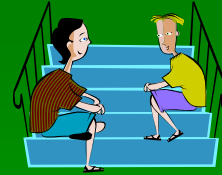
- Create a diverse list of informational websites
 - Provides an easy to use neighborhood resource for TOD
 - Allows residents to expand their knowledge of TOD and related streetscape concepts
- Completed by January 2009

Tactic 2:



- Create survey of current and desired neighborhood attributes
 - Quantifiable data collection
 - Qualitative neighborhood input
 - Allows residents to comment on the unique character of the neighborhood
 - Aids in developing template for proposed design
- Completed by May 2009

Tactic 3:



- Increase neighbor awareness of TOD
 - Attend and present available resources at neighborhood meetings
 - Engage neighbors in discussions about TOD and their urban village
 - Encourage neighbor participation in TOD meetings
- Ongoing

Success Metrics:



- Increased attendance at public meetings and workshops related to TOD
- Create enthusiasm for working with TOD in My Backyard
- Improvement of RNO's to get the message out about TOD
- TOD blends seamlessly into existing neighborhood
